

Hello, Melbourne! I'm feelin' mighty real - how 'bout you?

Inspired by prolific author (and festival guest!) Darryl W. Bullock's book David Bowie Made Me Gay: 100 Years of LGBT Music, the theme for the 2024 MQFF is "Formative Sound and Vision".



Yes, we gueers have long been hooked to the silver screen, coveting representations and reflections of ourselves, sometimes even only coming out through frisson-filled encounters with kindred spirits on screens big and small.

How apt, this theme, here in Melbourne – after all, the very first music video aired by MTV, The Buggles' "Video Killed the Radio Star", was directed by a gay Melburnian, Russell Mulcahy!

Rock 'n' roll was a revolution initiated by queer folk – notably, by queer people of colour. Everybody now, sing it loud 'n' proud: "Tutti frutti, good booty..." And how better to speak - nay, sing - to that truth than by opening with Any Other Way: The Jackie Shane Story – a gorgeous celebration of one of the greatest soul music artistes of the 20th century - never mind that you may never have seen or heard of her before now!

And that's just the opening act of this year's bumper festival, full-tobrimming with films right-on-theme (brand spankin' and classic queer musicals! Music docos! Docos that are also musicals! All MQFF cinema sessions are allocated seating unless stated at the time of booking. No need for queuing to get the best seats - simply select your preferred seats from the interactive seating map when booking.

BOOKING ONLINE

You can select your tickets via a browser on your desktop or mobile device and select your preferred seats from the interactive seating map.

BOOKING VIA THE MQFF APP

Select your tickets for each session and the app will automatically assign you the best available seats in the house. Want to select your own seats? — we recommend using a web browser on your desktop or mobile device.

CLASSIFICATION

The Classification Board grants MQFF special customs and censorship clearances, which means all audience members must be 18 years or over except where indicated.

CONCESSION TICKETS

Concession tickets are available to people with valid concession cards at time of entry to the cinema. This includes full-time students, pensioners, unwaged, seniors and valid health care card holders.

CONCESSION EARLY BIRD

Be rewarded for acting early! \$12.50 concession tickets will be available from October 18-20. Tickets are subject to availability, and ticket buyers must hold a valid concession card to book. Failure to present a valid concession card upon entry will result in needing to purchase a full-price ticket.

Turtles is set in the cosy Brussels nest of over-60s Thom (Dave Johns) and Henri (Olivier Gourmet), two peas in a pod-or so it seems. Henri, a recently retired cop, is becoming bored with domesticities with stay-at-home hubby Thom, the optimist of the pair, who is nonetheless increasingly wary of Henri's aloof behaviour (and time on dating apps) feeding the growing cracks in the relationship.

When Thom brings home a hook-up from the local pool, Henri soon follows suit and adds a dog to the rift (triggering Thom's allergies), and as things escalate, Thom petitions for a divorce. But who is entitled to keep the house, left to them years before by a late friend? And who the

pair of turtles, Topsy and Turvy, that came with it? Indignities and codependence aside, this is not the usual marriage/divorce narrative but a tender and thoughtfully paced examination of what happens to love as

THE BEAUTIFUL SUMMER

DIR. LAURA LUCHETTI 111 MIN | ITA | U15+

If the sun has felt like it's been a long time coming lately, warm your weary bones with director Laura Luchetti's effervescently loose adaptation of the proud (and persecuted) antifascist author Cesare Pavese's novel of the same name. Set in Turin in 1938, with the spectre of war not far off, it follows country girl Ginia (excellent newcomer Yile Yara Vianello) as she lands in the big city and, sharing an apartment with her big brother Severino (Nudes actor Nicolas Maupas), scores a gig as a seamstress at a fashion house. But life's turned upside-down the moment she first spies the vibrant Amelia (Deva Cassel, daughter of Monica Bellucci and Vincent Cassel), following her into a bohemian world of artists where anything and anyone is fair game, in this audience favourite from the Locarno Film Festival

THE VISITOR

Arguably Canadian cinema's most anarchic agent provocateur, The Misandrists director Bruce LaBruce has been blasting his punk art porn visions into the universe's most chaotically-inclined cinemas (or grubby VHS players) since the '80s. Sometimes they don't make it: L.A. Zombie was struck from the 2010 Melbourne International Film Festival by overzealous censors. Thankfully, his latest eye-popper snuck in the backdoor unassailed. A sacrilegious exhumation of the still-warm corpse of fellow queer button-pushing pioneer Pier Paolo Pasolini's Teorema (1968), this new crotch twist shifts the engarged drama from Italy to contemporary London, where Bishop Black's eponymous Visitor emerges naked from a suitcase as a refugee who soon invites themselves into a filthy rich, binary-bending family's mansion, seducing them to the cause one-by-horny-one. This NSFW fury was up for the Teddy Best Feature Award at this year's Berlinale.





SCARECROW IN A GARDEN OF CUCUMBERS

Rivalling City of Lost Souls for the mantle of campiest, most unhinged musical in this year's festival, Scarecrow in a Garden of Cucumbers was restored by the Academy Film Archive in 2022 after scarcely being seen since premiering 50 years prior. Presumed lost for much of that time, it now rates as one of the greatest queer film rediscoveries in many a long year. How on Earth did something so brilliantly, ceaselessly bonkers as this, and so much fun to watch with a crowd, ever retreat into obscurity?

In one of the earliest lead roles granted to a trans performer, Warhol Superstar Holly Woodlawn (seen in Paul Morrissey's *Trash* and *Women in Revolt!*) puts in a riotous turn as small-town girl Eve Harrington, who quickly finds life in New York City circa 1972 sure ain't like being in Kansas anymore. And how! Across a series of loopy, cartoonish, gag-filled episodes and madcap musical numbers — *that's* how.

Woodlawn's ferocious fellow Warhol Superstar Tally Brown chews no small amount of scenery as Mary Poppins, and the mayhem is only enhanced by voice cameos from none other than Bette Midler and Lily Tomlin! "A COMEDIC TOUR-DE-FORCE FOR WOODLAWN."

But when the death of his estranged father summons him home for the funeral, he's plagued by a disturbing presence while languishing in hotel quarantine.



The Queen of My Dreams is a vibrant exploration of identity, love and cultural connection infused with the lively spirit of a Bollywood musical. This semi-autobiographical film from debut writer-director Fawzia Mirza follows Azra, a queer Muslim graduate student living in Canada in 1999 with her non-Muslim girlfriend, Miriam. When family tragedy hits, Azra must return to her motherland of Pakistan where she's confronted with childhood memories and the friction of growing up with a conservative mother — but perhaps they're not so different, after all. Through the dual performances of Amrit Kaur, the narrative weaves between 1969 Karachi and 1999 Toronto, revealing the intricate bonds between mothers and daughters desperately seeking to define their own identity and decide their own path.



A companion piece to DeLear's posthumously published, unfiltered, highly explicit teenage diaries, I Could Not Believe It, Zizenbacher's film has a frantic punk energy, collaging materials galore from DeLear's handheld video diaries and featuring interviews with fashion designer Rick Owens, actor and Bongwater founding member, Ann Magnuson, and Seandy's former housemate, cult actor Susan Tyrrell (an Oscar

nominee for 1972's Fat City). While DeLear is sadly no longer with us, we can still learn from their example — this film delivers an object lesson in living life large, with multi-intersectional, punk rock aplomb!


